Course Description:

This course provides introduction to equitable and inclusive community engagement practices that support community-based environmental efforts addressing socioenvironmental issues. The course is open to students from diverse majors that have an interest in these topics:

- Introduction to socio-environmental justice issues relevant to Connecticut communities
- Principles of authentic community engagement
- Environmental education approaches that promote collective environmental
- Critical community science
- Culturally sustaining environmental education and trauma informed mentorship approaches
- Instinctual leadership & leading for change

#### Post-Course Opportunity

Opportunity: Undergraduate students enrolled in this course will have the opportunity to apply for 10-month paid environmental education leadership positions through the Natural Resources Conservation Academy (NRCA; <a href="https://nrca.uconn.edu/">https://nrca.uconn.edu/</a>, as NRCA Difference Maker Mentors (<a href="https://nrca.uconn.edu/dmm/">https://nrca.uconn.edu/</a>, as NRCA Difference Maker Mentors (DMMs) will serve as program leaders and near-peer mentors for the NRCA Conservation Ambassador Program (<a href="https://nrca.uconn.edu/cap/">https://nrca.uconn.edu/cap/</a>). Under the support and guidance of NRCA faculty and a graduate student, DMMs will have the unique opportunity to co-facilitate the summer field experience (July) and mentor a subset of teen participants during their community-based environmental action project in the following months (August to April). This opportunity will provide students with experience with leadership, authentic community engagement, environmental.
















## Difference Maker Mentors Hours & Pay Rate

- 10-month position
- Each DMM receives ~\$7,650
- ~450 hourcommitment (\$17/hour)

Jun 15-19	40	Assisting with Preparations for Field Experience
Jun 21-27	80 (over night)	Facilitating Weeklong Summer Field Experience
Jul 6-Aug 14	30	CAP Teen Mentoring and Bi-Weekly DMM Meetings (5 hours/week)
Fall Semester Aug 24-Dec 11	150	CAP Teen Mentoring and Weekly DMM Meetings (10 hours/week)
Spring Semester Jan 11-Apr 23	150	CAP Teen Mentoring and Weekly DMM Meetings (10 hours/week)
